The Nordic countries – Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden – are some of the most food-secure nations in the world with robust agricultural systems, advanced technology and comprehensive social safety nets ensuring that their population have reliable access to sufficient, safe and nutritious food.

This stands in stark contrast to many of the regions where WFP operates, where conflict, climate change and economic instability severely compromise food security.

Global hunger remains at record levels in today's post-pandemic world, with 343 million people expected to face acute hunger in 2025. Every day, WFP reaches millions of people across the

world with emergency food assistance, nutrition programs and operations to strengthen long-term food security.

The Nordic countries are vital partners for WFP, enabling our lifesaving and life-changing operations. As top donors of flexible funding, the Nordics also enhance our ability to make strategic and timely life-saving responses while in parallel investing in longer-term activities that help reduce needs over time.

In 2024, the Nordics were collectively the 5th largest donor to WFP, contributing more than USD 482 million to help us reach the most food-insecure people around the world.
